Club and Program Overview

The Royal Vancouver Yacht Club (RVYC) is one of the world's premier yacht clubs with over 5,000 members dedicated to promoting yachting, seamanship, and a strong sense of community. Located at Jericho home port in Vancouver, RVYC's Junior Training Program (JTP) provides summer sailing camps for youth ages 5 to 17+ throughout July and August.

Before the courses start, all instructors must attend mandatory, paid orientation days. Staff lunches are provided on all working days; however, housing is not. Our courses, run in two-week session blocks, utilize an extensive club-owned fleet, including Optimists, ILCAs, 29ers, RS Fevas, Windsurfers, Elliott 6Ms, and Capri 22s. The summer closes with RVYC's annual Commodore's Cup Regatta and Training Camp from August 25-28, offering young sailors an opportunity to demonstrate their progress and compete in a fun, supportive environment.

Instructors will have the chance to work in a beautiful environment, gaining valuable coaching experience while being part of a fun, high-paced, professional, and supportive team. There may also be additional work opportunities available outside of the JTP, including roles in RVYC's Keelboat Sailing Program, Race Committee, Mark-laying, and year-round Race Team coaching.

Job Overview

Our **Junior Summer Sailing Coaches** play a pivotal role in delivering high-quality sailing instruction and mentorship to all participants within the Junior Training Program's (JTP) summer camps. This position requires a skilled and passionate individual who can inspire, educate, and cultivate a love for the sport among RVYC's young sailors.

Duties & Responsibilities

1. Sailing Instruction

- Effectively teach the CANSail curriculum across all JTP classes.
- Collaborate with the Youth Learning Facilitators to instruct the Wet Feet (ages 5-7) and Opti Fun (7-10) course curriculums.
- Instruct various courses, including JTP Lime Green, JTP Green Fleet, Intro to Double-Handed Sailing, Olympic Sailing Pathways, and Junior Mariners.
- Continuously adapt instruction and teaching methods to accommodate different learning styles and abilities.
- Create a positive and inclusive training environment that fosters skill development and a passion for sailing.

2. Supervision and Safety:

- Ensure participant safety on and off the water by following all sailing regulations and RVYC safety protocols.
- Provide clear instruction on proper life-jacket usage, water safety, and emergency procedures.
- Report any incidents or concerns immediately to your direct supervisor.

3. Skill Development:

- Identify individual sailor strengths and areas for improvement, providing constructive feedback and tailored instruction plans.
- Design drills and exercises to develop confidence and sailing proficiency.

4. Team Collaboration:

- Work closely with fellow instructors to plan and coordinate daily schedules.
- Contribute to the development of a well-rounded curriculum aligning with program objectives.
- Attend mandatory morning and afternoon staff meetings.

5. **Communication**:

- Maintain clear, professional communication with participants and families.
- Provide progress updates and address parent inquires in a courteous, professional, and informative manner.

6. **Equipment and Maintenance**:

- Assist with setting up, maintaining, and storing all sailing equipment to ensure safety and proper functionality.
- Report all equipment issues to the appropriate staff member(s) for repair.
- Complete daily assigned chore tasks to facilitate smooth operations.

7. Role Model:

- Serve as a positive role model and mentor for young sailors.
- Promote teamwork, sportsmanship and respect for the marine environment.

Requirements & Qualifications

- Sail Canada Certified CANSail Instructor, with 2025 annual registration completed and certifications/prerequisites in good standing for the duration of their employment.
- Valid First Aid and CPR Certification (Standard First Aid or equivalent).
- Successful completion of a Criminal Record Background Check (company provided).
- Valid Pleasure Craft Operator Card.
- Completion of the Safe Sport Training Module by the Coaching Association of Canada (can be completed after confirmed employment and prior to contract start).
- Ability to adapt to rapidly changing conditions and situations to meet class needs.
- Strong instructional skills and ability to deliver a comprehensive curriculum.
- Strong communication, leadership, and teaching skills.
- Passion for youth development and creating a positive learning environment to inspire young sailors.
